Trustees Workshop Meeting 9-24-19

The Village of Cold Spring Board of Trustees held a meeting at the Village Hall, 85 Main Street on Tuesday September 24, 2019 at 7pm. Present were: Mayor David Merandy and Trustees Marie Early, Lynn Miller, Frances Murphy and Steve Voloto.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mayor Merandy called the meeting to order at 7:05pm and made a motion to enter into executive session. Trustee Early seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

At 7:38 pm Mayor Merandy made a motion to exit executive session. Trustee Murphy seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

PUTNAM COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORP. PRESIDENT KATHLEEN ABELS

Ms. Abels appeared before the Board to introduce herself and outline her plans. During her remarks she noted that:

- The east and west sides of the county need to be on the same page
- The EDC has a new website
- The EDC looks to leverage existing resources
- EDC is looking "beyond county borders" for ideas (that will benefit Putnam County)
- The mission of the EDC is to "foster economic vitality in the county" via grants to support the quality of life
- EDC supports infrastructure projects
- EDC seeks to promote tourism and business development
- EDC is a 501(c)(6) not-for-profit corporation that has no money of its own (to distribute within the county)
- Income to be derived from memberships and grants
- EDC is a resource for business and not a development agency

PUTNAM COUNTY TOURISM DIRECTOR TRACEY WALLER WALSH

Ms. Walsh appeared before the Board to introduce herself and outline her plans. During her remarks she noted that:

- She has traveled through the county to "listen and learn"
- She has met with Eliza Starbuck, chair of the Cold Spring Chamber of Commerce
- She wants to work with the Village to manage things
- The reestablished tourism department will remain in compliance with NYS law
- Department will advertise in area periodicals to re-introduce outsiders to Putnam County

- Department is looking into the best places to advertise (both locations, such as GCT, and magazines)
- Department seeks a stronger internet presence and has established a new website: www.visitputnam.org and a Facebook page
- Department seeks to make the trolley more effective. 1,000 persons used the trolley this season.
- Department seeks to promote the whole county

Several Board members made comments noting:

- Concern that Cold Spring doesn't get a proportional share of revenue from the county
- Cold Spring needs funding from the County to address infrastructure needs occasioned by the "tourist crunch"
- Tourism in Cold Spring has a large impact on all aspects of Village life
- Winter tourism should be supported

SUMMARY OF COMPLETE STREETS WORKSHOP

Roberto Muller, Philipstown Community Smart coordinator, made a presentation to the Board about the Complete Streets program. He noted that:

- Philipstown is in the process of creating a Complete Streets policy, as part of the Climate Smart Initiative
- Village of Cold Spring demographics
 - o 17% under 18
 - o 18.7% over 65
 - 7% under 65 live with disability
- Benefits include resource access for non-drivers and reduced emissions
- Public transportation options include the trolley and medical transport (offered by Office for Senior Resources)
- Suggested projects include:
 - Extend sidewalks from Manitou School to Boscobel
 - o Pedestrian corridor between Cold Spring and Garrison
 - o Raise crosswalks to provide greater visibility and pedestrian safety
 - o Provide pedestrian access to Perks Plaza from nearby homes
 - o Provide public transport between Perks Plaza and Cold Spring and/or a Park and Ride lot
- The Process
 - Plan, network and prioritize improvements
 - Develop Complete Streets resolution and guidelines
 - Promote engineering, education, enforcement, encouragement and evaluation
- Beacon has completed a Complete Streets resolution
- Dutchess County has created a Complete Streets survey, used in conjunction with any development

RESOLUTION 19-2019 AUTHORIZING JUSTICE COURT TO APPLY FOR JCAP GRANT

The following resolution was offered by Mayor Merandy for adoption and seconded by Trustee Murphy, to wit:

BE IT RESOLVED that the Village of Cold Spring Board of Trustees hereby authorizes the Village of Cold Spring Justice Court to apply for a JCAP Grant during the 2019-20 cycle for an amount of up to Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00).

Resolution officially adopted on 9/24/19 by a vote of 5-0-0-0.

AUTHORIZE MAYOR TO SIGN MOA WITH SEASTREAK FOR 2019 SEASON

Trustee Early made a motion to authorize the Mayor to sign a MOA with Seastreak for the 2019 season. Trustee Murphy seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

CORRESPONDENCE

The Village received an email from Andrea Corless requesting permission to hold a block party on B Street on October 5, 2019 between noon and 7pm.

Mayor Merandy made a motion to grant the request. Trustee Murphy seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

REQUEST BY THE AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY TO USE VILLAGE HALL FOR MEETINGS

The request was prompted by the fact that Town Hall will be unavailable during its renovation this fall.

Trustee Murphy made a motion to allow the American Legion Auxiliary to use Village Hall for meetings. Mayor Merandy seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

DISCUSSION OF PROPOSED CODE CHANGES REGARDING ESCROW

Changes to Village code have been recommended by Village Attorney John Furst. During the Board's discussion it was noted that:

- Code needs to be more specific (regarding escrow)
- What events require an escrow?
- Events requiring an escrow should be codified

- Escrow is used by the Board of Trustees and other Village boards to cover expense of legal and other professional advice necessary to carry out their work.
- A new Chapter is proposed to address escrow
- Trustee Early suggested that the Board postpone voting (on this matter) until:
 - A public hearing is held
 - A resolution is drafted
 - o A public hearing on the resolution is held

DISCUSSION ON PROPOSAL FOR FIREHOUSE FLOOR

The Village has received a proposal from CJGEO in the amount of \$20,640 to inject polyurethane grout to stabilize the firehouse floor. During the discussion it was noted that:

- What guarantee is offered?
- How much material (and what additional cost may be incurred) will be required?
- How will out-gassing be addressed?

The Board took no action on this matter.

APPROVAL OF BILLS

Trustee Miller made a motion to approve Batch # 5289 in the amount of \$44,218.21. Mayor Merandy seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

MINUTES

Mayor Merandy made a motion to table approval of the 9/3/19 minutes. Trustee Early seconded and the motion passed unanimously

ADJOURNMENT

Mayor Merandy made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Trustee Murphy seconded and the motion passed unanimously at 9:17pm.
