# Trustees Meeting 2-26-19

The Village of Cold Spring Board of Trustees held a meeting at the Cold Spring Village Hall, 85 Main Street on Tuesday February 26, 2019 at 7 pm. Present were: Mayor David Merandy and Trustees Marie Early, Lynn Miller, Frances Murphy and Steve Voloto.

#### INDEPENDENCE DAY COMMITTEE DISCUSSION

Mayor Merandy introduced the discussion noting his desire to keep the event as a community event. He also noted that:

- Nick Groomsbridge has agreed to sponsor the fireworks for the 2019 celebration
- There has been concern about reduced attendance due to the extreme heat experienced last year, resulting also in poor sales for vendors
- Concern remains about fundraising to cover cost for: police, bands, sound system and other miscellaneous costs
- Should the community event be scheduled for another day (i.e. Labor Day) with only fireworks on July 4<sup>th</sup>?
- The 4<sup>th</sup> of July committee will meet on 3-13-19 at 7pm. Location TBD and the first order of business will be to set a date

# **Board Discussion**

Board members noted that:

- Fireworks are the main attraction and the other events less so
- Vendor locations need to be more visible
- Parade participation hindered by heat-related issues
- Eliminate parade and keep some events and fireworks
- Only have local NFP vendors at waterfront on a first come/first served basis
- The West Point fireworks are scheduled for 7-6-19

# **Public Comment**

- Vendors don't see any business till after 4pm
- Music at the band shell is good
- Only local NFP's, who contribute their earnings back to the Village should be allowed, contributing to the "community" nature of the event
- Last year saw a 75% drop in revenue
- Make the event smaller and start it later
- Location of inflatables and other kids' activities were too deep into Dockside Park
- Kids' events should be at the waterfront where it's cooler

- More kids' activities should be provided to tide them over till the fireworks begin
- Historic issues should be highlighted, that could include: reading of the Declaration of Independence, sign-in book, kids' essay contest
- The parade is a "small town" aspect of the celebration that brings people to local businesses
- Fundraising is difficult and costs should be a line item in the Village budget
- School is not in session during the summer and so school bands are unavailable
- The Chamber of Commerce, as an organization, doesn't have sufficient fund to contribute to the festivities, though local members may contribute
- The Chamber would like to have data that can support an ROI from sponsorship
- There is a marketing aspect (to the event) even from local businesses that don't benefit directly from the event
