## Village of Cold Spring Highway Department April Monthly Report

For the month of April we repaired a manhole that had partially shifted off of it's structure on Fair St., and lowered a manhole on Lower Main St. which we paved around both upon completion. We used (4) large retaining wall concrete blocks, and donated lumber to build a storage platform for our salters. We swept Mountain Ave., Cedar St. & Spur, Locust Ridge, Orchard St., Fishkill Ave., Market St., Wall St., Northern Ave., West St., North St., Fish St., and lower Main St. with the sweeper. We cleaned the surface of the catch basins twice, and the subway & Dockside Property (6) times each. We turned on the water to both VCB & MPP facilities, and repaired a leaking water line & faulty flush handle at MPP restrooms. We cleaned & stocked VCB & MPP restrooms (4) times each. At Dockside Property we removed all of the larger driftwood while creating new scating with some of them, installed a new entrance post, and hung a new chain across the entrance (3 times). We had Fred Cook, Inc. onsite to suck out (21) basins around the Village. We installed (4) baby changing stations at VCB & MPP facilities (2 each). We started cutting the grass at our Parks, WTP, WWTP, and other Village owned properties. We rebuilt the North, South, and East walls of the basin located near the Eastern subway entrance. We ordered sign posts for the upcoming metered parking project. I met with Paul of Hahn Engineering to go over the drainage issue on Fair St. We pressure washed the entire subway, and replaced the sump pump in the subway's sump pit.

Fleet & Equipment:

- 2019 Ford F-250 had a front end alignment, tire balanced, and the axle casters increased
- 2001 International dump truck had a new floor welded into place in the body, and had rust holes on the body repaired by Mo.
- 2014 Bobcat had a new belt & tensioner installed by us, and a new windshield & hydraulic valve body installed by Summit Bobcat.
- We replaced our 240 Husqvarna chainsaw (scorched cylinder) with a 271 Stihl chainsaw.
- 2022 Kenworth had a leaking hydraulic fitting repaired, and the Diesel Exhaust Fluid tank filled at Monticello Kenworth.
- Homelite trash pump had its fuel tank, fuel lines, fuel shut off switch, and it's pump volute cleaned out & serviced.

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#### **CURRENT APPLICATIONS**

On May 2nd, we reviewed and approved a Modification to a Previously Approved COA at 30 Fair Street, concerning the configuration of windows and a new sliding door on the rear facade. We also reviewed and approved a Modification to a Previously Approved COA at 61 Paulding Street reincorporating a masonry chimney which was removed from plans during the design process. We reviewed and approved an application for new roofing and gutters at 12 Grove Court, an individual landmark. We reviewed and approved the applications for the new front door canopy at 5 Market Street and the redesigned front porch at 15 Parsonage Street. We also met in a workshop with the new owners of 22 Parsonage Street to discuss their exterior renovation plans.

- 1. The Planning Board met on April 13, 2023. We were unable to conduct business because of technical difficulties with the Village's Zoom capabilities. The board discussed setting a Special Meeting as soon as possible.
- 2. The Planning Board met on April 18, 2023, in a special session. The Board took up a Referral and Application from Foodtown to expand into the adjacent space formerly occupied by Soho Salon. A Public hearing was set for May 11, 2023. The Board also continued its discussion of the HHFT and the proposed Update of Sec. 134 of the Village Code.
- 3. The Planning Board met on April 27, 2023. The Planning Board took up the Referral and Application for a change of use from retail to restaurant from the tenant duly authorized to represent the owner of 81 Main St. The Board scheduled a Public Hearing for May 23, 2023. The Board also continued its discussion of the HHFT and the proposed Update of Sec. 134 of the Village Code.

### New Applications:

 Mayor's Park or Dockside - Putnam County Wine & Food Festival August 5-6, 2023 (11am-6pm) (Tabled until 5/31/23)

### Upcoming Approved Events:

- Bandstand Wedding August 2, 2023 (1pm-2pm)
- Bandstand Wedding September 23, 2023 (2pm-6pm)

#### New Recreation Commission Items:

- Resurfacing of the multi-use court at Mayor's Park was completed. Hoop height will be adjusted and tamper resistant hardware and foam padding for basketball hoops will be installed in a few weeks after curing of the blacktop.
- Ongoing discussions with John Maasik with the Friends of Philipstown regarding a combined effort of the 501c3 for Parks and Recreation. The Town is in favor of this if it is acceptable to the Village.
- Discussed modifications to the dog permit at Mayor's Park, which are in line with the suggestions from Dr. Benante. Discussing potential locations for a dedicated dog park in the Village.
- Proposed new picnic table for the Pavilion. Working with the Boy Scouts to assemble as part of a project.
- Ongoing discussions with the Philipstown Little League regarding use and rehab of the softball field.
- The Commission had a plaque made that was presented to Steve Etta honoring his 35+ years of service to the Recreation Commission.
- The Commission is discussing our short-term and long-term goals with the Village Parks and potential avenues to secure funding.

#### **Outstanding Recreation Commission Items:**

- Met with Trustee Woods on proposed changes to the Village code aligning with current responsibilities and incorporating Event Coordinator's role. Proposed revisions provided for review.
- Existing signage at Mayor's Park is being revised to consolidate and clarify access and restrictions. Awaiting sign installation.
- Proposed changes to event applications were made based on the Event Coordinator's and Mayor's feedback. Awaiting Trustees approval.
- The recreation survey was sent via email and social media. Results have been analyzed and will be used to schedule activities/leagues.
- The Commission has prepared a draft insurance liability waiver for activities for Trustees approval.
- 2023-24 Recreation Commission draft budget submitted to Village Accountant.
- Dock lights have been donated and are in the process of being ordered.
- Zoysia grass remediation at the south side of Mayor's Park needed.
- Lawn care (treatment and maintenance) agreements needed. Additional weeding and treatment needed along rocks as part of lawn care contract.

#### May 2023, Village of Cold Spring Report

- 1. New Highway Garage, the old trailer which housed our office staff was removed the first week of May, need to pave the parking lot and working on the punch list.
- 2. Proclamation honoring Matthew Junjulas for winning the 2023 Putnam County Youth bureau award.
- 3. Passed resolution approving indemnity Agreement for construction of Emergency Communications tower on the Town property by our salt shed.
- 4. The Nelsonville Fish & Fur for the children's Fish Derby on Sunday May 7<sup>th</sup> was aa big success.
- 5. Garrison Landing water Dist., we fracked one of the three well we have at the property and early results look promising.
- 6. Pass resolutions for the following :Appointed Lou Liotti to the Continental Village Parks District. Putnam County Mutual Aid plan, and updated Sexual Harassment Prevention Policy, and shared Service Agreement with NYS DOT.
- 7. Philipstown trails Committee presented the feasibility Study on the Multi-use Path Philipstown from Cold Spring to Garrison.
- Food scrape composting there are over 180 plus people are currently enrolled, we
  encourage more families to enroll. If anyone is interest visit our website
