§ 59-1. Findings; intent.

It is hereby declared and found that litter carelessly deposited in the Village is the cause of civic and public concern; that litter is a health, fire and safety hazard and pollutant; that litter control can result in substantial savings to taxpayers of the Village; and that litter is a matter affecting the public interest and consequently should be subject to supervision and administrative control for the purpose of safeguarding the health, safety and general welfare of the people of the Village.

§ 59-2. Definitions and word usage.

A. Word usage. For the purposes of this <u>chapterChapter</u>, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meanings given herein. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words used in the plural number include the singular number, and words used in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

B. Words defined. As used in this <u>chapterChapter</u>, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

COMMERCIAL PLACE - Any store or group thereof, including shopping centers, shopping plazas and other similar places wherein mercantile activities and services are offered to the public, and shall include all parking areas thereat.

GARBAGE- <u>PutrescibleDecayable</u> animal and vegetable wastes resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking and consumption of food.

LITTERING

HANDBILL - Any printed or written matter, any sample or device, circular, leaflet, pamphlet, paper, booklet or any other printed or otherwise reproduced original or copy of any matter of literature which does any of the following:

(1) Advertises for sale any merchandise, product, commodity or thing.

(2) Directs attention to any business or mercantile or commercial establishment or other activity for the purpose of, either directly or indirectly, promoting the interest thereof by sales.

(3) Directs attention to or advertises any meeting, theatrical performance, exhibition or event of any kind, for which an admission fee is charged for the purpose of private gain or profit.

(4) While containing reading matter other than advertising matter, is predominantly and essentially an advertisement and is distributed or circulated for advertising purposes or for the private benefit and gain of any person so engaged as advertiser or distributor.

LITTER - Garbage, refuse and rubbish, as defined herein, and all other waste material.

NEWSPAPER - Any newspaper of general circulation, as defined by law, any newspaper duly entered with the Post Office Department of the United States in accordance with federal statute or regulation and any newspaper filed and recorded with any recording officer, as provided by law. In addition thereto, "newspaper" shall mean and include any periodical or current magazine regularly published with not less than four (4) issues per year and sold to the public.

NONCOMMERCIAL HANDBILL - Any printed or written matter, any sample or device, circular, leaflet, pamphlet, newspaper, magazine, paper, booklet or any other printed or otherwise reproduced original or original or copies of any matter of literature not included in the aforesaid definitions of a "commercial handbill" or "newspaper."

PARK - A park, reservation, playground, beach, recreation center or any other public area in the Village or owned or used by the Village and devoted to active or passive recreation.

PERSON - Any person, firm, partnership, association, corporation, company or organization of any kind.

PRIVATE PREMISES - Any house, building or other structure designed or used, either wholly or in part, for private residential purposes, whether inhabited or temporarily or continuously uninhabited or vacant, and shall include any yard, grounds, walk, driveway, porch, steps, vestibule or mailbox belonging or appurtenant to such dwelling, house, building or other structure.

PUBLIC PLACE - Any and all streets, sidewalks, boulevards, alleys or other public ways and any and all public parks, squares, spaces, grounds and buildings.

REFUSE - All <u>putrescibledecayable</u> and <u>nonputresciblenon decayable</u> solid wastes, except body wastes, including garbage, rubbish, ashes, street cleanings, dead animals, abandoned automobiles and solid market and industrial wastes.

RUBBISH - Nonputrescible<u>Non decayable</u> solid wastes consisting of both combustible and noncombustible wastes, including but not limited to beer, soda and other metal cans or tops or flip tops of cans, glass bottles or bottle tops, cigarette packs, candy bar wrappers or any other paper or cellophane wrappings or any materials or object or wood, bedding, yard clippings, leaves and any other similar materials.

VEHICLE - Every device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway <u>or street</u>, including devices used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks.

VILLAGE - The Village of Cold Spring.

§ 59-3. Throwing litter in public places.

No <u>personPerson</u> shall deposit or throw <u>litterLitter</u> in or upon any street, sidewalk or other <u>public placePublic Place</u> within the Village, except in public <u>litterLitter</u> receptacles, in private receptacles for collection or in a public dump or lands officially designated by the Board of Trustees for that purpose.

§ 59-4. Manner of placing litter in receptacles.

Persons placing <u>litterLitter</u> in public or private receptacles shall do so in such a manner as to prevent it from being carried or deposited by the elements <u>or animals</u> upon any street, sidewalk or other <u>public placePublic Place</u> or upon private property.

§ 59-5. Depositing in gutters or streets.

No <u>personPerson</u> shall sweep or deposit in any gutter, street or other <u>public placePublic</u> <u>Place</u> within the Village the accumulation of <u>litterLitter</u> from any building or <u>litterLitter</u> from any public sidewalk or driveway.

§ 59-6. Litter from vehicles.

No person, while a driver or passenger in a <u>vehicleVehicle</u>, shall throw or deposit <u>litterLitter</u> upon any street or <u>public placePublic Place</u> within the Village or upon private property.

§ 59-7. Vehicles causing litter.

No person shall drive or move any truck or other <u>vehicleVehicle</u> within the Village unless such <u>vehicleVehicle</u> is safeguarded as to prevent any load, contents or <u>litterLitter</u> from being blown or deposited upon any street, alley or other <u>public place</u>, nor shall any <u>person drive or move any vehicle or truck within the Village the wheels or tires of which</u> <u>carry onto or deposit in any street</u>, alley or other public place mud, dirt, sticky substances, litter or foreign matter of any kind.<u>Public Place</u>.

§ 59-8. Litter in parks.

No <u>personPerson</u> shall throw or deposit <u>litterLitter</u> in any <u>parkPark</u> within the Village, except in public receptacles and in such a manner that the <u>litterLitter</u> will be prevented from being carried or deposited by the elements upon any part of the <u>parkPark</u> or upon any street or other <u>public placePublic Place</u>. Where public receptacles are not provided all such <u>litterLitter</u> shall be carried away from the <u>parkPark</u> by the <u>personPerson</u> responsible for its presence and properly disposed of elsewhere, as provided herein.

§ 59-9. Litter in public waters.

No <u>personPerson</u> shall throw or deposit <u>litterLitter</u> in any fountain, pond, lake, <u>river</u>, stream, bay or any other body of water in a <u>parkPark</u> or elsewhere within the Village.

§ 59-10. Handbills in public places.

No <u>personPerson</u> shall throw or deposit any <u>commercial or noncommercial</u> <u>handbillsHandbill</u> in or upon any sidewalk, street or other <u>public placePublic Place</u> within the Village. <u>Handbills on a tree or utility pole in the Village require a permit. See</u> <u>Chapter 104, Signs and Placards.</u>

§ 59-11. Handbills on vehicles.

No <u>personPerson</u> shall throw or deposit any <u>commercial or noncommercial</u> <u>handbillHandbill</u> in or upon any <u>vehicleVehicle</u>; provided, however, that it shall not be unlawful in any <u>public placePublic Place</u> for a <u>personPerson</u> to hand out or distribute, without charge to the receiver thereof, a <u>noncommercial handbillHandbill</u> to any occupant of a <u>vehicleVehicle</u> who is willing to accept it.

§ 59-12. Handbills on vacant premises.

No <u>personPerson</u> shall throw or deposit any <u>commercial or noncommercial</u> <u>handbillHandbill</u> in or upon any <u>private premisesPrivate Premises</u> which is temporarily or continuously uninhabited or vacant.

§ 59-13. Handbills on private premises.

A. No <u>personPerson</u> shall throw, deposit or distribute any <u>commercial or</u> <u>noncommercial handbillHandbill</u> in or upon <u>private premisesPrivate Premises</u> which are inhabited, except by handing or transmitting any such <u>handbillHandbill</u> directly to the owner, occupant or other <u>personPerson</u> then present in or upon such private premises.

B. Exemption for mail and <u>newspapersNewspapers</u>. The provisions of this section shall not apply to the distribution of mail by the United States or to <u>newspapersNewspapers</u>, as defined herein, except that newspapers shall be placed on private property in such a manner as to prevent their being carried or deposited by the elements upon any street or other <u>public placePublic Place</u> or upon private property.

§59-14. Litter on privatePrivate and commercial premises.

No <u>personPerson</u> shall throw or deposit <u>litterLitter</u> on any occupied private property or <u>commercial placeCommercial Place</u> within the Village, whether owned by such <u>personPerson</u> or not, except that the owner or <u>personPerson</u> in control of such private property or <u>commercial placeCommercial Place</u> may maintain authorized private receptacles for collection in such manner that <u>litterLitter</u> will be prevented from being carried or deposited by the elements upon any street or other <u>public placePublic Place</u> or upon any private property.

§ 59-15. Maintenance of commercial premises.

Each owner or <u>personPerson</u> in control of any <u>commercial placeCommercial Place</u>, including shopping centers and delivery and parking areas thereat, shall keep said places, parking fields, parking areas, delivery areas and other open areas which are a part of such <u>commercial placeCommercial Place</u> free from <u>litterLitter</u>.

§ 59-16. Maintenance of private premises.

The owner or <u>personPerson</u> in control of any private property shall at all times maintain such premises free of <u>litterLitter</u>; provided, however, that this section shall not prohibit the storage of <u>litterLitter</u> in authorized private receptacles for periodic collection by the Village authorities <u>or private carting services</u>.

§ 59-17. Preparation of garbage for collection.

All <u>garbageGarbage</u> and <u>refuseRefuse</u> shall be placed in metal or heavy plastic containers readily handled by collectors. All papers placed for collection shall be securely bound. Containers shall be set out for collection no earlier than 4 p.m. of the day prior to collection day and removed from Village property no later than <u>midnight</u> of <u>11:59 pm on</u> the day of collection. § 59-18. Litter on vacant lots.

A. No <u>personPerson</u> shall throw or deposit <u>litterLitter</u> on any open or vacant private property within the Village, whether owned by such <u>personPerson</u> or not.

B. The Board of Trustees or its designated representative is hereby authorized and empowered to notify the owner of any open or vacant private property or commercial placeCommercial Place within the Village, or the agent of such owner, to properly dispose of <u>litterLitter</u> located on such owner's property which is a nuisance or dangerous to public health, safety or welfare. Such notice shall be by certified mail, addressed to said owner at his/her last known address.

§ 59-19. Deposit restricted. [Added 9-9-1993 by L.L. No. 7-1993]

No Person shall deposit Garbage, Litter, Rubbish or Refuse collected from any Commercial Place or Private Premises in any public Litter receptacle or private receptacle, other than their own, within the Village of Cold Spring.

§ 59-20. Penalties for offenses.

Any <u>personPerson</u> committing an offense against any provision of this <u>chapterChapter</u> shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a violation pursuant to the Penal Law of the State of New York, punishable by a fine not exceeding two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) or by imprisonment for a term not exceeding fifteen (15) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. The continuance of an offense for each day <u>{(twenty-four (24) hours])</u> shall be deemed a distinct and separate violation.

§ 59-21. Severability.

If any section or subsection or clause of this <u>chapterChapter</u> shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such adjudication shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the Article, section, paragraph, sentence, clause or provision thereof directly involved in the controversy which such judgment shall have been rendered.

§ 59-2122. Repealer.

§59-21

The existing provisions of Chapter 59 of the Code of the Village of Cold Spring are repealed as of the effective date of this <u>chapterChapter</u>, except that this repeal shall not affect or prevent the prosecution or punishment of any <u>personPerson</u> for any act done or committed in violation of such prior <u>chapterChapter</u> while such <u>chapterChapter</u> was in effect and prior to the taking effect of the new Chapter 59.

§ 59-22. Deposit restricted. [Added 9-9-1993 by L.L. No. 7-1993]

- No person shall deposit garbage, litter, rubbish or refuse collected from any commercial place or private premises in any public litter receptacle or private receptacle, other than their own, within the Village of Cold Spring.
